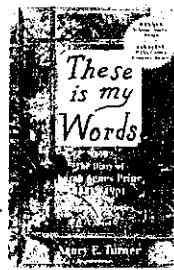
Author Charles Portis tells the story of 14-year-old Mattie Ross who seeks revenge for the death of her



father with the aid of an ornery U.S. Marshall named Rooster Cogburn.

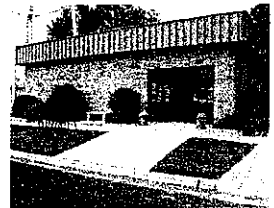
The 1969 big screen version of the story starred John Wayne as Rooster Cogburn and the 2010 Coen brothers remake starred Jeff Bridges.

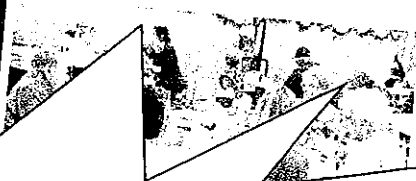

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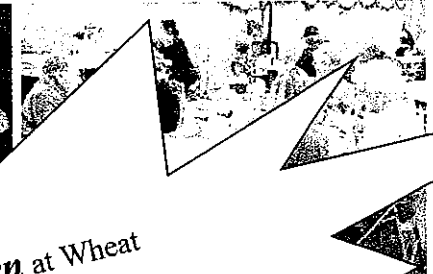

Frederic Remington Area Historical Society Meeting

On February 3, 2014, the Frederic Remington Area Historical Society (FRAHS) will have their monthly meeting at the Remington High School, 7:30 p.m.

The program will focus on the **German POWs who were brought to Kansas between 1943 and 1946**. A POW tent camp was set up in Peabody on September 11, 1943 just south of town at an old creamery and then relocated to the 1919 Eyestone Building at 122 West 2nd on November 28, 1943. Local farmers and business could hire these POW by the day. Many farmers in the FRAHS area utilized this inexpensive man-power. Communication with these POWs was enhanced because many farmers in the FRAHS area were of German decent. **Mark Schock, Rose Hill, Kansas will initiate the discussion and provide a general review.** He coauthored the book *Prisoners of War in Kansas 1943-1946* with Lowell A. May. This book is a great reference source. The evening will conclude with Walter Penner, Wilbert Wiebe, Melvin Epp, and anyone else who has a vignette or story, telling of their remembrance or interaction with the POWs. Everyone who attends will be giving a postcard of the painting of the Emmaus Mennonite Church drawn by a POW; the church building burned in 2008.

Vegetable Sales Again at the Larry Brown

Invitational Track Meet!!

The RHS Greenhouse Project will have tomato and green pepper plants available for sale at the May 9th Larry Brown Invitational Track Meet. There will be three varieties of tomato plants and one variety of green pepper plants. The cost for each plant will be the same as last year - \$3.00 for one plant, or \$5.00 for two plants (of any variety). Contact Mrs. Schowalter (mjschowalter@usd206.org) at RHS with questions. All funds will go back into the Greenhouse Project - for supplies, tools, and other things needed to grow!

The first variety that will be for sale are Sioux tomato plants. This is an heirloom variety that was originally released in 1944 by the University of Nebraska. It has incredible flavor and reliably large harvests, even in hot weather. It appears to have an "average" size (6 oz.), but is sweet yet tangy and full of the rich, complex flavors that make a delicious tomato memorable. Indeterminate. 70 days.

The second variety is the Beefmaster VFN Hybrid. This is one of America's favorite variety. It boasts a solid, meaty, flavorful red fruit that can weigh up to 2 pounds! It has vigorous vines and outstanding fruit taste and quality. Indeterminate. 80 days.

Next, are the Super Sweet 100 VF Hybrid small tomatoes. This is a home gardener favorite that has more disease resistance than other varieties, while keeping the same fabulous taste. These small, round 1 oz. cherry tomatoes are deliciously sweet with a high Vitamin C content. Long clusters of fruit load up on tall, vigorous plants and continue to bear until frost. Indeterminate. 65 days.

The pepper plants are the King Arthur Hybrid. These are very large, 4-lobed blocky bell pepper, and are hard to beat for its earliness and large size. The fruit becomes 4 ½ inches long and wide, and seems to set well even in heat. Plants provide good foliage cover and are resistant to two types of bacterial spot and three pepper viruses. 60 days green; 75 days red.

The Greenhouse Project is always in need of your empty pots, trays, or seedling containers. Every two seconds, someone in America needs blood or blood products. By giving about one hour of your time to donate blood, you will be helping as many as three patients get the blood they need. This winter has been especially hard on the supplies of blood and blood products. At the present time, the American Red Cross is down about 35,000 units of blood! Your donation is very important to all those in need.

What to expect when you donate? You will review travel, medication and donation information. ORDINANCE NO. 577

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES ON THE STREETS OF WHITEWATER, KANSAS AS PROVIDED BY K.S.A. 8-15, 100 AND PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN RESTRICTION AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE SAME. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WHITEWATER, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. The words and phrases "All-Terrain Vehicle", and "Owner" shall have the meaning prescribed to such word or phrase in Article 1 to the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities" as prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, as adopted by the governing body.

SECTION 2. Subject to the restrictions noted below, All-Terrain Vehicles may be operated upon the public highways, streets, roads and alleys within the corporate limits of the city only between sunrise and sunset. In addition, the owner or operator of the ATV must obey all City traffic ordinances.

SECTION 3. The owner or operation of the ATV must provided motor vehicle liability insurance coverage on such ATV as required for a motor vehicle in accordance with the Kansas Automobile Injury Reparation Act, K.S.A. 40-3101 et seq.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding the restrictions noted above, an ATV may be operated at anytime by law enforcement for law enforcement purposes or when used in a parade authorized by the City governing body or by City Personnel in connection with city work or maintenance.

SECTION 5. No person shall operate an ATV on any public highway, street, road, or alley within the corporate limits of the City unless such person has a valid driver's license and is at least 18 years old.

SECTION 6. No passengers will be allowed on an ATV unless the ATV is manufactured as a two person unit. Any passenger under age 18 is required to wear a helmet.

SECTION 7. Violation of this section is punishable by a mandatory fine of \$150 for the first offense and \$300 for the second and subsequent offenses.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption and publication in THE EL DORADO TIMES, the official newspaper of said City. (First published in THE EL DORADO TIMES ON JANUARY, 2011)

The library recently received two grants for the purchase of Playaway Bookpacks.

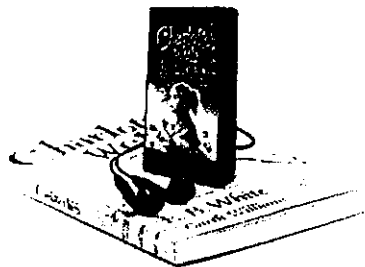
The **South Central Kansas Library System** awarded the library a \$500 Programming Grant and the **Whitewater Community Foundation** awarded a \$450 grant.

struggling and reluctant readers in addition to auditory and special education learners and ESL patrons.

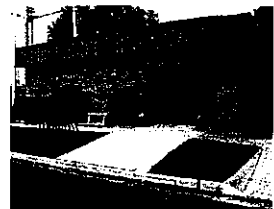
Titles were selected based on input from students, teachers, library staff and librarians from the Berean and Remington school systems. They include popular titles as well as classics from Kinder-

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Responders of the Whitewater River Fire Department have continued to be active in your community. As of the end of July, 99 calls for assistance have been answered this year. Although most of the calls continue to be medical related, many grass fire alarms were sounded in the early spring.

At a national level, volunteerism, in general, has declined during the last 20 years. The Whitewater/ Elbing area is not exempt. Schools, churches, civic organizations, emergency services, and various other clubs and groups have all experienced that decrease in involvement.

The Whitewater River Fire District continues to have a number of dedicated personnel willing to respond in your time of need. The number of available personnel has declined to the point that causes concern about being able to cover the calls we have. Mutual aid agreements with all the surrounding Fire Departments in Butler and Harvey Counties has significantly helped for responding to the larger fires but at a cost of extended response time.

The desire of your local Emergency Responders is to be able to respond, in a timely manner, to all your requests for assistance. In order to assure that, more members are needed. If you, or someone you know, are willing to give a small portion of time to train and respond in your community, please stop by the Fire Office for information on how you can be involved.

The office is at 119 South Main. It is generally open week days from 8:00 to 5:00 but, due to the demands of the job, the office may be closed briefly at any time for emergency calls, equipment maintenance, related meetings, or other business. You are welcome to call 799-2121 to ask questions or make an appointment.
