Interactive Presentation About Pluto-Bound New Horizons Probe

After more than 9 years of travel in our Solar System, NASA's robotic probe "New Horizons" is scheduled to arrive at Pluto this summer.

What scientists expect New Horizons to see at Pluto is very different from what previous space probes "Galileo" and "Cassini" have seen at Jupiter and Saturn.

After speeding past Pluto, New Horizons will continue travelling further away from Earth and is expected to visit other Kuiper Belt objects besides Pluto.

Whitewater resident, Bob Henderson, is an astronomy hobbyist who studied

math and physics in college with an eye toward astronomy.

He has prepared a presentation that consists of multiple pictures showing some of the "out-of-this-world" things seen by the Galileo and Cassini-Huygens probes, and will look at some of the differences between these probes and New Horizons.

Though Henderson has extensive education and held positions as a WSU professor and staff scientist at Boeing, the interactive presentation will easily be understood and enjoyed by middle school students through adults.

This free event will take place at the library on **Monday, March 2, 2015, at 7:30 pm.**

"Bloody Kansas." Ken Spurgeon, History & Government Teacher at Northfield School of the Liberal Arts, Newman University and Executive Director of Lone Chimney Films, Inc., Wichita. The Civil War technically began in the early 1860s after Lincoln was inaugurated as president. The major issue was state's rights. But major battles over state's rights were initiated here in Kansas between 1855 and 1860, which escalated into the war that pitted the Union factions against the opposing Confederate states. Mr. Spurgeon has authored the 2013 book, *A Kansas Soldier at War: The Civil War Letters of Christian & Elise Dubach Isely* in which he collected first-hand information about the Civil War as it impacted his ancestral family.

Kansas Reads to Preschoolers is an annual event promoting reading to children under the age of five and is sponsored by the Kansas State Library.

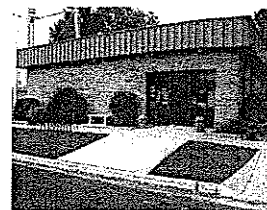
Is Your Mama a Llama? by Deborah Guarino is the featured book this year. Story Time children and parents received
