## March City Council Highlights

The Whitewater City Council met on March 23, 2026. Mayor Timothy Eldredge presided with all members present.

### Key Actions Approved:

- Hiring three seasonal summer helpers (Public Works, City Office, and Parks & Rec) good option for high school/college students.
- Replacement of aging regulatory signs (estimated: \$1,500).
- New wayfinder directional signs with updated city logo (estimated: \$500).
- Crack sealing on Poplar, Cottonwood, and Cottonwood Court (estimated: \$4,000).

### Financial Snapshot:

The city maintains a healthy position with about 8 months of operating reserves. Recent expenses included a new truck and annual sewer cleaning. Five utility accounts face shut-off on March 25 if unpaid. New bills will be issued that day.

### Infrastructure & Drainage:

- “Jeep’s Alley” work is now complete (ditch graded on the north end).
- Council discussed drainage issues on Locust Street, storm drains, and the creek. KDOT inspected the 196 & Elm bridge; Army Corps of Engineers may review downstream drainage.
- City is pursuing a KDOT money-share grant for road repairs and gathering community support letters.

### Community Notes

- City-Wide Clean Up was successfully completed March 21 with Waste Connections.
- Area-Wide Garage Sales are scheduled for June 12 & 13.

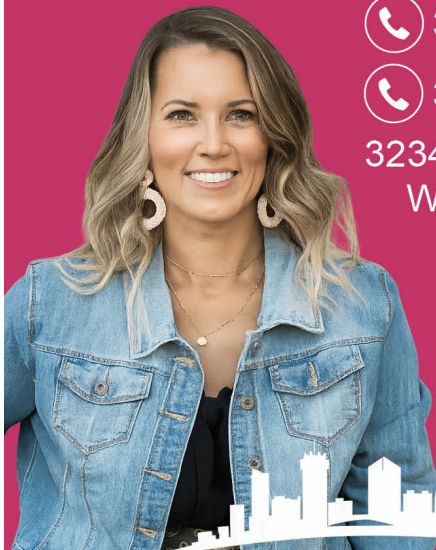

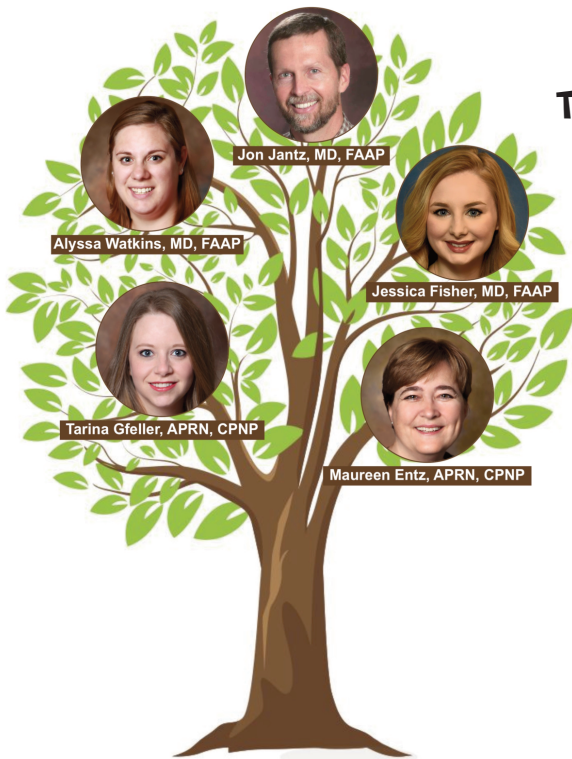

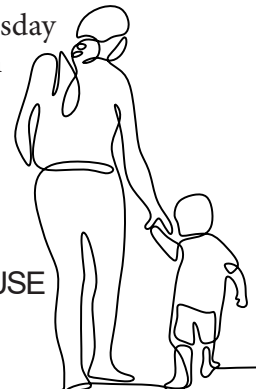

## North Butler 4-H Club: Nails, Moon Drawings, Parent Takeover & Music!

The February Meeting of the North Butler 4-H Club was held on February 9 at Emmaus Church at 7pm. Acting president Harley McLaughlin called the meeting to order. Song Leader Gracia Brewer led the song "One Pop, Two Pop". Parliamentarian Julia Amend led a talk about using the phrase "I Move" when making a motion. She gave a few examples then asked members present questions about it. Those who answered correctly received a small piece of candy. The program started with a demonstration on "How to do your nails" by Maya Klingenberg. Lastly, Kate Klingenberg did a demonstration about how to draw the moon in the sky. To end the evening, Recreation leader Donovan Brewer led the club in a game.

The March Meeting of the North Butler 4-H Club was held on March 9 at Emmaus Church at 7pm. This month was the parents turn to take over for their 4-Hers. Parents ran the meeting instead of the children and parents were also in charge of the program. Mindy Amend called the meeting to order and parents answered roll for the 4-Hers by answering the question "What was your favorite Childhood Movie". Debora Claassen congratulated those members who participated in 4-H Days: Ella Amend, who received a purple on her reading and a blue on her instrumental solo; Julia Amend, who received a purple on her reading and Kiera Yarbrough, who received a blue on her instrumental solo. For the program, Kiley Miller played guitar while leading the club in the "Campfire Song" and "Buffalo Gals". Next Ashley Anderson gave a presentation about the Potawatomi Indians. Lastly the Brewers talked about their Mission Trip to Hawaii.

## HISTORY HIGHLIGHTED

### Nieman Homesteading

Immigration began in the Whitewater area about the same time that Kansas became a state. George and Howard Nieman, brothers, staked their claims in 1869. George got the quarter-section where Whitewater is located. Howard claimed the quarter-section immediately west of George's, across the Whitewater River in Harvey County.

Isaac and Eliza Nieman began their family in New Berlin, Pennsylvania. After the birth of seven children, the family moved to Tipton, Iowa. That was 1854. Three more children were born after the move to Iowa. Mr. Nieman died in 1862, the same year as the birth of his youngest son.

George, who was the eldest of the family, went to California in 1864. He returned to Iowa three years later to continue on the family farm. Within a couple years, George and Howard came to Kansas.

Both brothers complied with the requirements of homesteading by breaking sod and improving their land. George built a log cabin east of the Whitewater River. The location was right in the middle of the current Main Street, about a block north of Wheat State Manor property. We have no information on the location of Howard's early house.

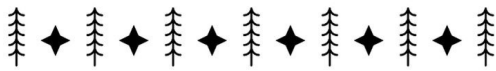
