## May City Council Highlights

The Whitewater City Council met on May 26, 2026. Mayor Eldredge presided.

### Key Actions Approved:

- Resolution No. 2026-0526 – Updated roofing standards to align with current Kansas and Butler County codes, making it easier for property owners to meet insurance and building requirements.
- Animal Nuisance Fines established: 1st offense \$50, 2nd offense \$100, 3rd and subsequent offenses \$250 plus court costs.
- Koop Painting awarded \$8,205 to paint some City buildings, including the Ballfield #1 bathrooms.
- Ordinance No. 646 approved, adopting the updated codification of City ordinances.
- Side-by-side rental authorized through Ravenscraft Imp. for City evaluation.
- Performance-based raise approved for City Superintendent Andrew Hanna.

### Financial Snapshot:

The City continues to maintain a strong financial position. As of April 30, 2026, the total cash balance was \$715,935 with a net increase of \$62,016 for the year and solid operating reserves.

### Infrastructure & Maintenance:

- New bridge installed at ballfields; 100 tons of asphalt donated for Scout House parking lot and a foul pole was relocated at Ballfield #1.
- RHS workday completed (painting, mulching, and cleanup).
- Elm Street Creek cleanout underway; all summer helpers have started work.

### Community Notes

- Thelma “Jeep” Edris thanked the City for alley improvements.
- Randy Jensen raised drainage concerns on farmland south of town via the Elm Street ditch.
- New food truck Bumblebee Barbeque held its grand opening May 30.
- Area-Wide Garage Sales: June 12-13.
- Planning & Zoning Commission met with Foster Design consultant to begin learning roles and developing a new Comprehensive Plan.

## What's Bugging the Garden This Year?

Every year brings with it a new set of challenges in the garden, and this year is no different. This year, everything, including insects, appears to be emerging earlier than we typically see, thanks to warmer-than-normal weather.

### Bagworms

These insects hatched several weeks earlier than normal this year, and it's already time to spray for treatment. Several active ingredients can be used to kill bagworms, including spinosad, permethrin, acephate, and cyfluthrin. Be sure to thoroughly cover all the foliage with the spray to kill the bagworms.

### Japanese Beetles

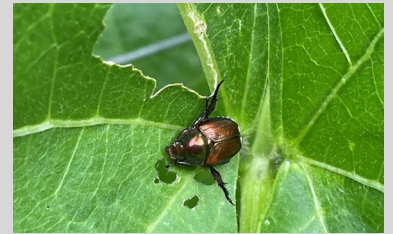
These insects are one of the most destructive pests of lawns, gardens, and ornamental plants. The adults hatch in May and lay eggs in July. If you have a small number of beetles on your plants, you can pick them off and throw them into a bucket of soapy water. Products containing permethrin, pyrethrin, or carbaryl will all provide a couple of weeks of control but must be reapplied.

### Squash bugs

Once mated, the females will begin laying eggs from June to mid-August, with hatching 7-14 days after laying. While the eggs are probably not hatching yet, with our warmer-than-normal temperatures, we should expect eggs to start hatching here soon. If you find eggs, horticultural oils can be used to treat them, or permethrin can be used against nymphs.

### Armyworms

While armyworms have not been spotted in Kansas yet, I would plan to start scouting for them in late June and early July. An infestation in turf can be detected by applying irritants such as dish detergent. Add one-quarter cup of dry detergent or one ounce of liquid detergent to one gallon of water in a sprinkling can, then apply the solution to one square yard of turfgrass where an infestation is suspected.



That means, as gardeners, we need to be thinking about scouting and controlling insects at different times than we traditionally have. Above are some insects you should scout for and treat if they have been an issue in the past.

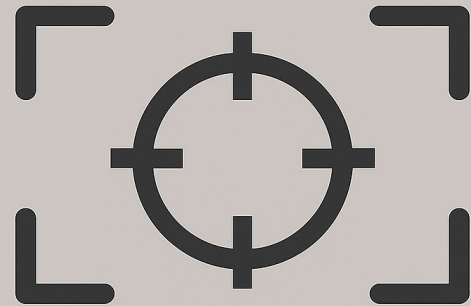

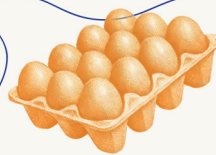

## **HISTORY HIGHLIGHTED Rail Roads**



*Railroad Construction*

In 1885, a railroad was built through this area from east to west. For local perspective, this came through El Dorado and on to McPherson and points beyond. Stations and depots were quite evenly spaced along the road, commonly 6-8 miles apart, and towns were encouraged at these places. Between El Dorado and Newton, the towns were Hopkins, Potwin, Brainerd, Annelly, and McLain.

In 1887, another railroad was proposed from north to south. It was built from Herington to Peabody and was to continue in a south/southwest direction. The proposal was to take the train to Brainerd and Towanda and then on to Wichita.

George Nieman went to the railroad company with a question about where they would get the water they needed. A steam engine at that time, on level terrain, needed to take on water every twenty miles or so. There was water in Peabody, there was water in Towanda but that was too far. Brainerd had no river water to offer and wells were always questionable. George's 160 acres had a river running through and it was close to the twenty mile mark.

The railroad changed their plan and turned toward George's land. The point where two railroads intersected had significant attraction.

# MAYOR'S MUMBLINGS

We have two outstanding school systems, whether it be Frederick Remington School District or Berean Academy. Our kids have great educational opportunities. Speaking of outstanding learning opportunities, the Whitewater Library is a fantastic place. If you haven't visited it, please do it. The Head Librarian Jean Thiessen is one of the hardest working people I have met.

The Whitewater Fire District is an important asset for the community and surrounding areas. Fire Chief Bob Bartlett does a great job of taking care of our local needs and getting our volunteers the necessary training to keep us safe.

The City Staff have really educated me and made my duties a lot easier. Anne Morrow, the City Clerk, has a great amount of knowledge in the short time she has been here. Anne has really kept things running smoothly and reminded me of what I can and can't do as mayor. City Superintendent Andrew Hanna has been very diligent in keeping the city running even when the mayor (me) has dumb requests or questions. I've learned more about the sewage system than I ever knew. Mr. Hanna's assistant Brandon Maus has been with the city for several years and has provided me with valuable insight into City operations. As you have noticed this summer, we have hired some summer help, and they are doing a fantastic job other than getting stuck in the mud, Nolan Sweazy and Grady Jones. We also have an office helper for Anne, Chloe Callstrom, who has really helped us organize and get the old records whipped into shape. And finally, is the City Treasurer Terry Ullum. This guy is incredible, if it wasn't for him not sure what I would do when it comes to finances for the city. He definitely keeps the purse strings tight but does open it for my occasional good idea. He says we can do that, but Council needs to approve it.

Then we have citizens who volunteer to serve on our various boards. Those Boards are the Cemetery, Parks and Recreation, Planning & Zoning and Library Boards. I want to thank the individuals that sit on these boards for all the hard work that they do for the Community. This is another thankless job that doesn't get the appreciation it deserves. If you are interested in any of these boards, please reach out to Anne or me, so when an opening occurs, we can have someone ready to step in and help.

The City and Remington School District have worked together to make major improvements to Jerry Hill Memorial Ball Park. There will be more projects in the future so keep your eyes open for them. We also will be updating several of the City Buildings in the next couple of months.

If you have ideas or suggestions, please bring them to me. Just remember your idea might need funding so have those ideas in mind also.

## WHAT IS A HYPERSCALE DATA CENTER?

These massive industrial complexes store digital data on servers which need cooling; this data is more than just online searches or every day smartphone use. 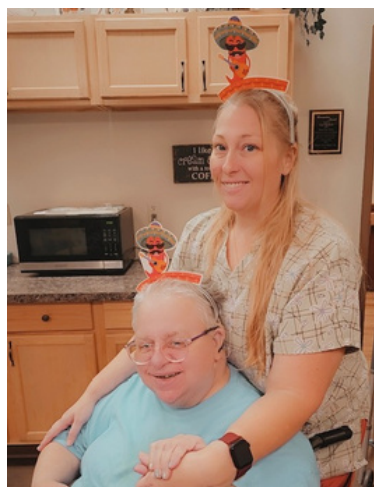

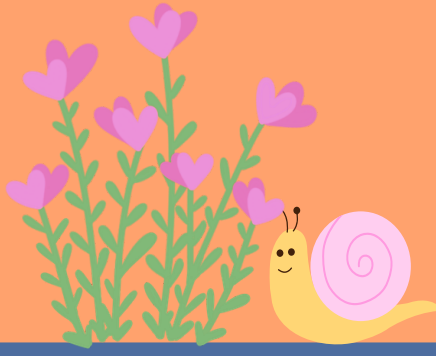
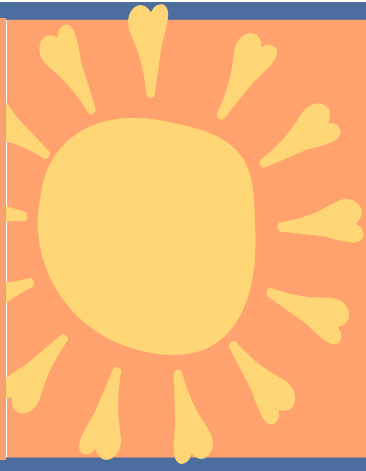
